### **Chesterfield Historical Society of Virginia to Present A Concise History of Printing, Paper and Binding**

CHESTERFIELD, VA – The Chesterfield Historical Society of Virginia and Chesterfield County Department of Parks and Recreation will present *A Concise History of Printing, Paper and Binding*, a lecture at the Chesterfield County Museum on Saturday, Aug. 27, at 11 a.m.

This free lecture will explore the historical highlights, development and techniques of paper making, printing and bookbinding and how they evolved over thousands of years. Participants will also explore the history and development of printing in the colonies, especially in Williamsburg and Richmond, Virginia. Hunter Willis will be joining the lecture to speak. He has been recreating 18<sup>th</sup> century bindings since 2013 and has extensively studied the arts of bookbinding, printing, and learned from some of today's most experienced facsimile bookbinders.
