Chesterfield, November 2, 2021 - The Chesterfield Historical Society of Virginia (CHSV) and the Chesterfield County Department of Parks and Recreation presents “**Powhatan Indians: The People of the River**” at Magnolia Grange House Museum, 10020 Iron Bridge Road, Chesterfield, VA 23832 on Saturday, November 20, 2021 at noon.

This event is meant to provide educational information for the community and to increase awareness about Chesterfield County’s historical sites.

Join Chesterfield Historical Society of Virginia and Chesterfield County Department of Parks and Recreation for “Powhatan Indians: The People of the River”, a program recognizing Native American culture. The guest presenter for this event will be Josh LeHuray, the Education Supervisor of Henricus Historical Park in Chesterfield. The speaker has also served as Co-director of the Janesville Fife and Drum Corps out of Janesville, Wisconsin and as an adjunct history professor at Rappahannock Community College in Virginia. His book, *Virginians Will Dance or Die! The Importance of Music in Pre-Revolutionary Williamsburg*, was published in 2016. LeHuray’s free, one-hour program will explore the food, hunting, transportation, social dynamic, and tribal structure of the Powhatan Indians, using historic paintings and images from Henricus.
