Sacagawea: Forgotten Frontierswoman

CHESTERFIELD, VA – The Chesterfield Historical Society of Virginia and Chesterfield County Department of Parks and Recreation will present a lecture at the Chesterfield County Museum on Saturday, November 5 at 11:00 a.m.: Sacagawea: Forgotten Frontierswoman. Learn how Sacagawea influenced the success of the Lewis and Clark Expedition by uncovering the truths of her role as the only woman and mother along for the journey. Was she just a casual tag-along, or did her geographical knowledge, culture, and resilience alter the course of the trip? This presentation is the result of research performed by Nicole Brooks for a Virginia State University Thesis Project.
